

MOOSEHEART CHILDREN FOLLOW FAITH WHICH
PREVAILED IN THEIR ORIGINAL HOME

The House of God at Mooseheart, with its Tower of Tolerance rising high above the treetops of the surrounding Fox River Valley, is dedicated to one of the basic precepts of the Loyal Order of Moose, "You must believe in God, and worship Him in your own way, and allow others the same freedom."

Each child enrolled at Mooseheart receives spiritual and moral training in the religious faith which prevailed in his or her former home.

A resident Protestant chaplain lives with his family in a home on the Mooseheart campus; in conjunction with qualified Catholic lay instructors, they supervise the religious training of the boys and girls and minister to their spiritual needs.

Religious instruction is included within the academic and vocational training program of the children. In a Sunday-school program begun in 2001, the chaplains direct the Protestant children in studying the Bible and Christian ethics, and the Catholic children in studying the tenets of their faith.

Catholic Mass is celebrated by a visiting priest each Sunday morning at 9:00 a.m. in the House of God, and Protestant Services follow at 10:15 a.m. The chaplains hold special services on holy days during the year and are available to the students for counseling and guidance.
