

Reopening Guidelines On Social Distancing

Update floor plans for common dining areas, redesigning seating arrangements to ensure at least six feet of separation between table setups. Limit party size at tables to no more than the established "maximums approved" as recommended by CDC or approved by local and state government. Stagger members sitting at the bar area.

Post signage at the entrance that states that no one with a fever or symptoms of COVID-19 is to be permitted in the Lodge.

Consider requiring waitstaff/bartender to wear face coverings (as recommended by the CDC) if they have direct contact with members & guests.

Provide hand sanitizer for members to use, including contactless hand sanitizing stations, and post signs reminding members about social distancing.

Try not to allow members to congregate in waiting areas or bar areas. Design a process to ensure members stay separate while waiting to be seated. The process can include floor markings, outdoor distancing, waiting in cars, etc. Consider an exit from the facility separate from the entrance. Determine ingress/egress to and from restrooms to establish paths that mitigate proximity for members and staff.

Where possible, workstations should be staggered so employees avoid standing directly opposite one another or next to each other. Where six feet of separation is not possible, consider other options (e.g., face coverings) and increase the frequency of surface cleaning and sanitizing.

Limit the number of employees allowed simultaneously in break rooms.
