# Chastain Looks to Repeat Win in Kansas and Enhance His Playoff Status

This past Sunday, Ross Chastain saved his best for last, running well in the final stage to secure his 11<sup>th</sup> top-10 result of the season. Moose International and Trackhouse Racing's Chastain finished ninth in the 301-lap NASCAR Cup Series race at New Hampshire Motor Speedway in Loudon. The race marked the fourth of NASCAR's 10 playoff races and served as the first race in the second round.

With his ninth-place finish Sunday, Chastain is ninth of the 12 remaining playoff drivers but only 12 points below the eighth-place cutoff line with this Sunday's race at Kansas Speedway and the Oct. 5 race on the Roval at Charlotte Motor Speedway remaining in the second round. Four drivers will be eliminated every three races, with the four remaining drivers competing in a winner-take-all Championship race at Phoenix Raceway on Nov. 2.

Heading to Kansas should be good news for Ross, as he won his fifth Cup Series race last September in Kansas. The No. 1 Chevrolet returned to the front of the pack immediately after the race's final restart to secure the lead, as drivers battled hard for second behind him. As the laps clicked off, Chastain managed to hold the race lead over William Byron, who hovered between three and six-tenths of a second behind the leader during the final run, but was never able to make significant enough gains to get by.

Members looking to cheer Ross on to victory during the Hollywood Casino 400 at Kansas Speedway can catch the race this Sunday, September 28th at 3:00pm ET on the USA Network.
