## Avoid Transfer Errors that can Impact Years of Service

Members are proud of their years of service with the Moose but sometimes lose those years due to clerical errors. Members who are close to their expiration date need to pay dues at their *current* lodge prior to requesting a transfer. If not, they are frequently entered into LCL as a new member and lose their original enrollment date. Lodge officers should provide guidance to members on transfers as well as reinstating vs re-enrolling. Additional information regarding this can be found on our website in the Membership area. Chastain gathered it back up, but spent several laps on pit road receiving repairs before heading to the garage for more repairs. He eventually returned to the track 26 laps down and finished the event in 28th..

*"We had a great start to the weekend at Phoenix with the No. 1 team. Qualifying sixth was huge to secure us a starting spot up front at a track like this. We were kind of plugging along in the race with a pretty good car and Brandon (McSwain) made a two-tire strategy call to get us solid track position. It was great until we got hit from behind and went for a spin. The guys worked on it for a few laps and got me back out there. We made the best of it and that's all you can really do. We'll focus on next weekend at Las Vegas."* – Ross Chastain
