Moose Legion Code of Rules Changes Approved by Board of Directors

During its February 2026 meeting, the Moose International Board of Directors approved proposed changes to the Moose Legion Code of Rules. These are the first changes since July 2022.

A summary of the changes is attached to this email. The amended Code of Rules will go into effect on May 1, 2026. New books are in the process of being printed. Each Moose Legion will receive eight copies. The updated Code of Rules will also be uploaded to the Moose International website.

Notice from Compliance Department Regarding Cannabinoid-Infused Beer (THC)

As per the General Laws of The Moose Sec. 48.2 :The use of all cannabis products is absolutely prohibited at any time in the social quarters, Lodge home, or on Lodge property.

Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is a cannabinoid, and a cannabinoid is any of a group of closely related compounds which include cannabinol and the active constituents of cannabis. **Therefore, the sale of any beer that is infused with cannabidiol (CBD) or tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is NOT allowed to be sold or consumed on Moose property.**

Chastain Races in the Moose Chevrolet This Sunday

Ross Chastain will be sporting the red and black Moose Fraternity colors this weekend as he races in the Goodyear 400 at his favorite track, Darlington Raceway. This is the first Moose “primary” race in 2026, the rest being Atlanta in July, Bristol in September and Martinsville in November. The last two races are part of the playoff series and will help determine which racer wins the season championship.

Chastain is running triple-duty this weekend at Darlington, racing in Friday night's Craftsman Truck Series event for Niece Motorsports, suiting up for JR Motorsports in Saturday's O'Reilly Auto Parts Series race and wheeling his Trackhouse No. 1 in Sunday's Cup Series main event, the Goodyear 400 (3 p.m. ET, FS1, HBO Max, MRN Radio, SiriusXM NASCAR Radio).

Ross has won one Cup Series race in the Moose Fraternity car, Talladega in 2022, but has other moments of prominence, most notably the Hail Melon run at Martinsville that catapulted him into the final four playoffs, where he eventually finished the season in second place. This past weekend, Chastain's team didn't have the speed or handling for a top run in Las Vegas, finishing the day near the middle of the pack. He is anticipating a much better race this weekend in South Carolina.

"17th-place finish today for our No. 1 Chevrolet. We worked on the handling all day. The long green flag runs didn't help us any but we kept working at it. I'm looking forward to getting to my favorite track this weekend at Darlington in the Moose Chevrolet." – Ross Chastain
