Clarification of Moose Legion Code of Rules Changes

The Moose Legion & Higher Degrees Department, as well as the Training Department, have received calls from Moose Legions regarding scheduling of Moose Legion Educational Conferences (MLEC's). This is due to the approved changes to the Moose Legion Code of Rules, specifically the change related to training having to be completed prior to May 1. Keep in mind that all of the changes go into effect on May 1, 2026; therefore, the requirement for training to be completed prior to the start of a new Moose fiscal year would not be relevant until the elections and installations in Spring, 2027. Those elected to a Moose Legion Board of Directors for the 2026-2027 fiscal year still have until July 1, 2026 to complete training. This will be the last year to which that rule applies.

Notice from Compliance Department regarding Cannabinoid-Infused Beer (THC)

As per the General Laws of The Moose Sec. 48.2 :The use of all cannabis products is absolutely prohibited at any time in the social quarters, Lodge home, or on Lodge property.

1. **Tetrahydrocannabinol (THC)** is a cannabinoid, and a cannabinoid is any of a group of closely related compounds which include cannabinol and the active constituents of cannabis. Therefore, the sale of any beer that is infused with cannabidiol (CBD) or tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) is NOT allowed to be sold or consumed on Moose property.

Chastain Finishes 16th at Darlington, Races Next in Martinsville

Ross Chastain started from 25th at Darlington Raceway and his Moose Chevrolet was a little bit tight, but it transitioned to loose handling just before the first stop on lap 40. He finished the stage 17th. Chastain battled in the top 10 for a majority of the beginning of the second stage. On lap 145 while pitting under green, Chastain lost several spots after a long pit stop and completed the stage in 20th. In the final stage, Chastain worked his way through the field and ultimately finished the race 16th.

"An up and down day for our Moose Chevrolet. We had a loose handling car but were pretty good on the long runs. I got a speeding penalty on pit road and that set us back. The guys worked hard to give us a lead lap finish, we just didn't have enough in the end to contend for more. I felt that we had a top 10 car today, just not the result to show." – Ross Chastain

Ross Chastain makes his 15th Cup Series start at Martinsville Speedway on Sunday. Ross enters this weekend with three consecutive top-10 finishes at Martinsville. He has racked up five top-10s in the eight races since driving the No. 1 Chevrolet for Trackhouse Racing.

For the second consecutive weekend, Chastain will also compete in the NASCAR O'Reilly Auto Parts Series. On Saturday, he will drive the No. 91 for DGM Racing.
