Funds Still Available in Local Marketing Grant Program

At the beginning of the 2025-26 fiscal year, the Moose International Board of Directors approved \$500,000 in funding for lodges to market themselves within their communities. The current program closes when the fiscal year ends (April 30, 2026) or the funds run out, whichever comes first. As of March 4, funds are still available in the program.

Funds are to be used to promote the lodge locally at events, fairs, sporting competitions, etc. Funds may also be used to sponsor local teams, buy local advertising, hold public events at the lodge, or generally improve the public perception of the Moose and the lodge within the community.

Stage Win for Chastain at COTA – Phoenix Up Next

In the first stage of the Circuit of the Americas race in Austin, Texas, Moose Fraternity driver Ross Chastain led the Trackhouse Racing entries to the green from the second position. He maintained a top-five track position throughout the first stage before leading three laps and going on to win the stage, his first of the season. Chastain eventually found himself third just before pitting on lap 71 during the final stage. Unfortunately, on lap 74, Chastain lost a right rear wheel and the caution came out. He quickly made it to pit road for service and served a two-lap penalty. The penalty put him deep in the field, however, resulting in a 35th-place finish.

"We had a pretty good Chevy today at COTA. We started second because of all the work we put into qualifying yesterday so that really paid off. It was nice to get a stage win. My crew chief, Brandon McSwain, made good adjustments throughout the race. I made an error earlier in the race and then we had the wheel issue, but as I always tell the guys, we're in this together. So, we'll put today behind us and I'm looking forward to Phoenix." – Ross Chastain

The next race is in Phoenix at a track where Ross has won before.

They act as a key liaison, offering guidance, training, and support to Lodge leaders and members to foster a positive and successful environment.
