## Lodge Safety Report Change

The Loss Prevention Lodge Safety Reports program has undergone a number of changes. Lodge Safety Reports are now completed by the Territory Managers. The report itself has also changed after receiving input from the Moose International Loss Prevention Committee, Moose International Membership and Risk Management Staff. The new report will reflect an in-depth comprehensive evaluation of the lodge and its operations to assure the protection of the lodge, attendees, assets and operations. Risks will be identified, requiring compliance, driving a culture of safety through clear, accurate and actionable reporting. A copy of the "New" Lodge Safety Report is attached.

## Looking for Speed at Talladega

Ross Chastain will race the Trackhouse Racing No. 1 Chevrolet on April 26th at the Talladega Superspeedway in the Jack Link's 500. Ross makes his 15th Cup Series start on Sunday at Talladega and ninth while driving the No. 1 Chevrolet for Trackhouse Racing. The Florida native captured the win at Talladega in the Moose Fraternity Chevrolet in April of 2022 in a thrilling finish with a .105-second margin of victory. At drafting style tracks this season, he has a best finish of third-place at EchoPark Speedway located in Hampton, Ga.

Last Weekend at Kansas, long green flag runs meant few opportunities for the crew to work on Ross's No. 1 Chevrolet. While the handling improved towards the end of the race, Chastain was trapped off of the lead lap and ultimately finished 26th.
