Heart of the Community Scholarship Program Applications Due June 30th

The deadline for the Heart of Community Scholarship Program is approaching quickly. Enter your High School JUNIOR (Graduating Class of 2027) for a chance to win up to a \$5,000 scholarship with the Moose - The Heart of the Community Scholarship Program.

The applicant must:

- Be a student of the high school graduating Class of 2027 (to be verified by a high school official);
- Have a father, mother, step-parent, grandparent or legal guardian who is a current member of the Moose in good standing (Applicant is NOT required to reside in the same household); and,
- Have a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or equivalent verified by a copy of student's transcript.

(Completing these criteria qualifies for a chance for a \$1,000 scholarship.)

If the applicant completes one or more of the optional criteria below, he/she will qualify for a chance for a \$5,000 scholarship:

- In-School / Extra-Curricular activities (i.e. school sports teams, band, chess club, theater, etc.) To satisfy this requirement a school official must verify this by completing their section of the application.
- Out-of-School activities (i.e. employment, scouting programs, music lessons, non-school related sports) To satisfy this requirement, Moose International must receive a letter or email from the student's supervising adult (boss, troop leader, etc.) with the application no later than June 30, 2026. The letter should include: 1) The name, title, email, and phone number of the supervising adult; 2) Details of the student's participation; 3) The

type of activities they engaged in; and, 4) The dates/date range of their participation. (Submit by email or mail together with the application and transcript.)

On our website, click on the Programs & Events link located on the far left of the Members Area page, then scroll down and click on the Moose - The Heart of the Community Scholarship Program link.

Mailed applications must be postmarked on or before June 30, 2026. Application must be completed in its entirety to be valid.

Between November 1, 2025 and April 30, 2026 if you received a one-time use code for sponsoring your fifth (5th) new or re-enrolled member into The Moose, please remember to redeem the code prior to June 30, 2026.

- Or to sponsor a new or re-enrolling member when using the Online Lodge Membership Application. It covers the cost of the applicant's dues and the \$20 application fee. Note it cannot be used for the current online only application promotion of No Application Fee for Online Applications with Two Year's Dues

You or your recipient needs a My Membership Record account to redeem that code for a dues payment under the area labeled Coupons. When using the code for an online application it should be entered in the Payment Information area; click on the drop-down menu for the option to enter the code. Chastain Logs Second Straight Top-Ten Finish in San Diego

Moose Fraternity NASCAR driver Ross Chastain raced to a seventh-place finish in San Diego last Sunday after an eighth-place finish the week before at Pocono. Ross was able to stay out of trouble early in the race, as moments after a restart on Lap 32, a violent wreck in Turn 1 wiped out a handful of notable contenders, including teammates Connor Zilisch and pole winner Shane van Gisbergen.

“Really, we stayed out of most of the chaos. We worked on gaining more rear grip all day and to be able to get the rear tires to live longer and have more grip from the start to the end of each run. Brandon McSwain (crew chief) was able to make adjustments to do that. We only half-spun one time, but other than that, it was a clean day.” – Ross Chastain

Ross now heads up the coast to Sonoma for the Toyota/Save Mart 350. Last year, Chastain won the first stage of the race before eventually falling back to 24th. He has had some success on road tracks earlier this year as well, with a stage win at Watkins Glen in May.
